The DuBourg Center across Merchant Street will be the venue for "Stitches Over Time", the SGAG Quilt Show & Sale, happening August 13 & 14 from 10am to 5pm, Jour de Fete weekend. Entry is open to residents of Ste. Genevieve County, either individuals or groups. There is no entry fee and no judging. Two quilts per entrant. Entry forms available at the Art Center.

Historic quilts and the history of quilting in the County will be featured, along with a live demonstration.

The Art Center will open a new Guild member art exhibit featuring (but not limited to) fiber art on August 12, running through mid-November. Plans include exciting group assemblages plus works by a guest fiber artist, talks and presentations.

The display of giclee prints of John James Audubon's self portrait and unattributed portraits of his business partner, Ferdinand Rozier and his wife Constance, created a great deal of interest and were the subject of two talks; an introduction to the subject by Carolyn Bach on April 22nd, and some in-depth research by local historian James Baker on Saturday.
